Isaiah 42.1-9; Psalm 29; Acts 10.34-43; Matthew 3.13-17

In the Gospel reading we are given an opportunity to celebrate the baptism of Christ the Messiah. He was baptized by John in the River Jordan to show us that Jesus appreciated his humanity - the essence of incarnation. This points to us that God chooses to use the ordinary to perform the extraordinary. The most important thing is to vield to the will of God for his grace to flow. John wanted to refuse to baptize Jesus because he (John) thought he was not qualified to do so from his human standpoint but when he submitted to the will of God, he did this ministry of baptizing Jesus and the River Jordan, the ordinary river. Many times we feel we are not worthy of doing a given

assignment in the Church because we are entangled by our past. God is calling us to surrender our limitations and our imperfections to him and invite him to use us as he will. The baptism of Jesus also should remind us to renew our baptismal vows as we renew our faith.

Let us pray for the ministers of the Word both lay and ordained that they shall avail themselves to be used of God as did John without exalting their limitations and challenges in life. Lord sanctify your servants and renew their commitment to your service through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
