Parish Fire Policy: Code Red Days

If a code red day is declared (this is the most extreme rating) then please note that all services and/or parish activities will be cancelled on that day. This policy will apply both on weekends and during the week. For other fire danger ratings, it is important that everyone follows their own fire plan. Your own fire plan must always take precedence even if you are on a rostered duty.

Make sure you have a fire plan and review it regularly.
