Second Sunday of Advent: Peace Creating peace



through education
Jesus tells us that to live

our faith; we must actively work to spread peace across the Earth. In war-torn Pakistan, building a just, peaceful society starts with breaking down the barriers to education. Through your Christmas Bowl gifts, you can give children the chance to go to school, escape poverty and create peaceful, productive lives.

Many families can't afford the cost of schooling or don't see the value of education. On top of this, many teachers are poorly trained and use corporal punishment, which limits learning and makes children too frightened to attend class.

Only 15 per cent of poor rural girls in Pakistan finish primary school, compared to 40 per cent of their male counterparts. Without an education, these girls are more likely to marry young, get sick, miss out on work opportunities and live in poverty.

But through your support of the Christmas Bowl, you can help girls to overcome these barriers. Your gifts will support Act for Peace's local partner, Community World Service Asia, (CWSA) to roll out a new early education program. You'll help train female teachers, fund teaching materials and raise awareness with parents about the importance of education for both girls and boys.
