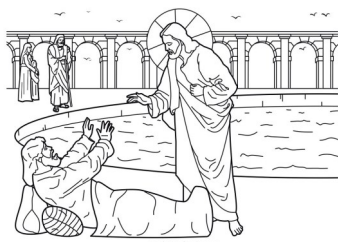

Nomination and Election of Synod Representatives

The Archbishop sent his mandate requiring me to invite the Electors of St Margaret's Eltham to proceed to the election of 2 Lay Synod Representatives, and 1 Alternate Lay Representative. In accordance with the Synod Act, we'll hold an election on 9th June 2019 after the Pentecost service (one service that day at 9:30am) - if the number of nominations exceeds the positions!

If you'd like to nominate to be a representative of this parish for the Diocesan Synod please advise Keren no later than Sunday 26th May. Diocesan Synod, the annual "church parliament", is usually held in October - this year 16th-19th October. It requires attendance at the Synod Service on the Wednesday evening, then Synod in session Thursday and Friday nights from 7:00pm-10:30pm, and Saturday from 10am-5pm (and yes, it's always a bit of a marathon!). If you're elected this year, the period of service will be for three years, as each synod spans three years. Our many thanks to Sally Petty and Felicity Wiltshire, who have been our synod reps for the last three years.
