16th June 2019 Day of Pentecost

Refugee Week

The week 16th to 21st June is Refugee Week and on Friday 21st June from 6:00pm to 8:00pm there will be an opportunity to:

- ◆ See posters about treatment of refugees.
- ◆ View a short video put out by the Group called Love Makes a Way.
- ◆ Read the letter sent by Kon of the Asylum Seekers Resource Centre (ASRC).

St Margaret's is collecting foodstuffs for the ASRC and people are invited to bring long life food to this event or to church services.

Favoured foods include Basmati rice, noodles, tinned beans, fish, lentils and tomatoes. Long life milk and breakfast cereals and sweet bikkies which are used for morning teas at the centre.

Do Justice hopes that Parishioners and others will support the appeal for foodstuffs between Sunday 16th and the end of June.



Pathways

As you may be aware, St Margaret's has signed up to be part of the Pathways programme through the Diocese. This programme is about helping us to discern one new ministry, and then see through getting it up and running. We need a team of folk who have an interest and desire to be engaged in the next chapter of our parish, to be part of a Mission Action Team. The MAT will meet monthly, and expect to be involved in 3 workshop/retreats each year with the other two parishes who are part of our cohort.
