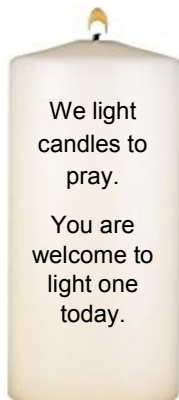

Everyone is invited to the next meeting of Faith Issues Discussion Monday 19 April 2021 at the home of Mitzi and David Tuke 135 Pitt Street Eltham at 7.30pm.

Mitzi will lead us in an introductory discussion on the complimentary relationship between Science and our Christian faith. In particular she will discuss the work of ISCAST *which is a network of people, from students to distinguished academics, exploring the interface of science, technology, and the Christian faith.*

At the following meeting Monday 3 May, Chris Mulherin the Executive Director of ISCAST will visit the Parish to comprehensively explore with us this interface. He is well-placed to do so.

The Rev. Dr Chris Mulherin is an Anglican minister with a background in engineering, philosophy, and theology. Chris's doctorate in philosophical theology and philosophy of science dealt with the relationship between scientific and other knowledge claims such as those of theology.

It is hoped that a larger than normal number will attend to discuss this important faith issue. All parishioners and friends are warmly invited. A light supper will conclude the discussion.

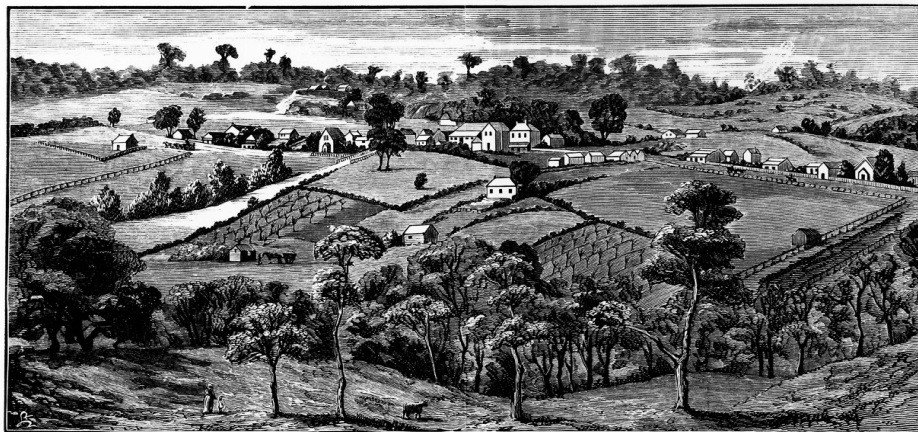
