Last Sunday, the Archbishop permitted us to announce Rev. Yvette Daniel's acceptance to take up her appointment at St. Margaret's Eltham. She will be instituted on November 16th @ 7:30 pm.

Yvette comes to us from St. Francis Church of England, Newcastle-on-Tyne. She will arrive the first week in November with her son Marco.

Before her ordination Rev. Yvette had spent many years working in the community as a Police Officer with Northumbria Police for 10 years, followed by 2 years as Manager of a Woman's refuge, as a Strategic Domestic Violence Coordinator and a Domestic Violence and Abuse worker. As a Deacon/priest Assistant Curate, she has had many development roles and led a number of groups during her time at St. Francis in the Newcastle Diocese.

## **Parish Council Report**

The August meeting of Parish Council was held by zoom on Monday 28 August. Extracts from the Minutes (available to Parishioners) follow.

- Correspondence was received from the Anglican Board of Mission for our \$4000 donation to the Holy Land Gaza Child Nutrition Project; from the Christmas Bowl appeal requesting an ambassador; and Geoff Sandy regarding the Heritage oak tree
- The Vicar was thanked for her ongoing work and noted that she highlighted that of several people are needing transport to church.
- The financial report was received which identified we are still in a healthy position. Several abnormal maintenance costs were identified including the leaking foyer roof. The committee will start preparing next year's budget.
- Other Sub Committee reports were received from: Pastoral Care, Marketing and Communications and Do Justice.
- Property noted the final design for the new notice board and investigation on the replacement of the kitchen boiling water heater.
- The Communications proposal for an Events advertising template to be included in the Event's Planning document was endorsed.
- And the Do Justice Concept for a Sensory Garden and the engagement of consultant was approved but being mindful or possible restrictions on what can be achieved on the considerina the compacted undersurface of the labyrinth (old tennis court) and how the garden would be maintained. The concept plan is to come back to Parish Council for consideration.
- The final Mission Allocation for 2022-23 was approved that \$4,000 be donated to the Bush Church Aid (BCA)
- The September Parish Concert preparations are almost complete.
- Child safety: We are now fully compliant including the display of posters. →
- Most groups have lodged Terms of Reference as requested. 6
- groups have not responded.
- Taizé Service ~ 33 attended when the new cross was blessed. Thanks to Tony Michaelson for stepping up to play the piano.
- November St Margaret's Day lunch advertising has begun.

- Institution of our new vicar Revd. Yvette: save the date St Margaret's Day November 16th.
- AM (or AGM) is on Nov 19<sup>th</sup> before we welcome Revd. Yvette and farewell Revd. Linda with great thanks at the Parish Lunch Celebration.
