Even the Devil Quotes Scripture with Rev Dr Robyn Whitaker THIS SUNDAY 22nd OCTOBER AT 3.00PM (A 'Zoom only' meeting)

Robyn has been ordained as a Minister of the Word in the Uniting Church since 1998. She is a biblical scholar and historian with research expertise in apocalypticism, biblical images of evil, Greco-Roman rhetoric, New Testament gospels, and late Christian apocalyptic literature. Robyn regularly writes for a popular audiences in addition to her scholarly work. She was listed in The <u>Conversation's Yearbook</u> of "50 Standout Articles from Australia's Top Thinkers" in both 2017 and 2018, and has an article in the 2021 volume celebratory <u>50 standout articles</u> from the first ten years of The Conversation.

In *Even the Devil Quotes Scriptures*, Whitaker asks how Christians might ethically and faithfully interpret the Bible for the modern world. Looking at how the Bible itself models interpretation, she argues for an approach that is flexible, contextual, and acknowledges a diversity of voices all under the rubric of love of neighbour.
