

Professor Dr Anne Pattel-Gray will explore Australia's First Nations Spirituality, Culture and Ancestral Narratives of the Creator's actions and interaction with Aboriginal peoples by defining the Creator's relationship within our understanding and worldview. The responsibility and generosity of care to family, community and Country will also be explored.

Anne Pattel-Gray PHD DD, is Professor of Indigenous studies and inaugural head of the School of Indigenous Studies at the University of Divinity and a member of the Uniting Church. She is an esteemed theologian, doctor of Philosophy, accomplished author, activist and advocate for the rights of Indigenous People.

Professor Pattel-Gray is a renowned Aboriginal leader nationally and internationally and a descendant of the Bidjara Karikari people of Queensland. She has held numerous leadership and consultancy roles in various organisations including the World Council of Churches, Gurukul Theological Seminary, Harvard University, and Otago University Professor Pattel-Gray has achieved many firsts in her distinguished career.

In 1995, she was the first Aboriginal person to be awarded a PhD by the University of Sydney and the first Aboriginal person published by Oxford University Press in 1998 with The Great White Flood: Racism in Australia.
