ABM PEW REFLECTIONS

The Pharisees were not impressed by Jesus and his disciples plucking and eating grain on the Sabbath. Nor were they impressed by his curing a man with a withered hand on the same day. In response to their first objection, Jesus reminds them of the story of hungry David and his companions eating the shewbread, reserved solely in the Temple for its priests. The second story sees Jesus trying to get the Pharisees to admit that doing good on the Sabbath is not a bad thing – but rather than agreeing with him, the obvious and right thing to do, they plot to get rid of him instead.

- Help us to see, Lord, that rules that do not bring relief and goodness when they are needed are rules that may need at least to be bent, if not broken.
- Give thanks for the Church of South India, remembering especially today their ministry in a predominantly non-Christian context.

**Annually National Week (NRW) occurs
Reconciliation in Australia from 27 May to 3 June.**

These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the 1967 Referendum acknowledging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and the High Court Mabo decision, respectively. NRW is preceded by National Sorry Day on 26 May. The 2024 theme, 'Now More Than Ever', is a reminder to all Australians to continue the fight for justice and the rights of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. This prayer was written by Bishop Arthur Malcolm, taken from 'A Prayer Book for Australia'. I invite each one of us to commit to praying this prayer during this week.

*Lord God, bring us together as one,
Reconciled with you and with each other.
You made us in your likeness.
You gave us your Son, Jesus Christ.
He has given us forgiveness from sin.
Lord God, bring us together as one,
Different in culture, but given new life in Jesus Christ:
Together as your body, your church, your people.
Lord God, bring us together as one,
Reconciled, healed, forgiven,
Sharing you with others as you have called us to do.
In Jesus Christ, let us be together as one.*

Scratch program

From the diocesan Youth and Children’s Ministry team leaders

Scratch is an informed, practical, and hopeful project that works with vicars and key leaders to initiate children and young people ministry in their church. Most churches can’t afford a paid worker and find it difficult to recruit volunteers. They’re also acutely aware that the kind of ministry needed may need to look very different from previous models to accommodate the changing culture. Scratch is ADOM’s answer to this challenge. It’s designed to give you the insights, models, and confidence you need to develop a strategy that will work in your own parish context, however humble the beginning.

Scratch starts in June and runs over 6 sessions spread over 8 weeks and includes lunch.
