Reconciliation of a Penitent (Confession)

During his earthly ministry, it was not only Jesus' miraculous power that astounded and transformed people, but also his willingness to forgive sins.

Our Sunday services and midweek service of Holy Communion always include a corporate prayer of confession, after which the presiding priest pronounces God's forgiveness of our sins. Yet it is also true that sometimes we benefit from the opportunity to confess privately and specifically those things that trouble our consciences.

Reconciliation of a Penitent, or Confession, is a rite in which anyone who repents of sins may confess them to God in the presence of a priest and receive the assurance of pardon and the grace of absolution.

Would you like to be a Synod Rep.

Synod is the gathering of the clergy and lay representatives of the Diocese with the Archbishop to make decisions about our corporate life in Christ.

Ideally each church should have 3 lay synod representatives – however at St Margaret's we have two: Sally Petty and Felicity Wiltshire.

'Being part of synod is an important role. They make decisions in areas, such as:

- Establishing how clergy are appointed to and removed from parishes, and how parishes function in terms of their finances, property and officebearers.
- Ensuring children and vulnerable people are protected in church and church-related activities.
- Monitoring and reviewing diocesan finances and budgets, and the oversight of diocesan property; and
- Encouraging and sometimes implementing change in areas such as who can be ordained (Melbourne Synod was a pioneer in the women's ordination movement, for example), and in ecumenical relationships.

Synod also comments on issues and concerns in Australian society from the Gospel perspective, such as care of the environment, marriage and family life, education, and refugees.'

Common cup as of Sunday 19th May – Pentecost Sunday

- What does holy communion mean to you?
- What delights you about participating in it?
- What do you think/believe happens to the bread and wine during the prayers of thanksgiving?
- How does receiving Holy Communion help you see the world differently?
- Is holy communion for you purely a re- enactment of the last super.

There can be no doubt that Covid 19 changed or altered how we practiced being a worshipping community on Sunday mornings and during our midweek service. One of those practices is how we celebrated Holy Communion.

Globally, across all denominations, different ways of instituting and sharing of this meal took place. Some examples being, abstinence all together, sharing the eucharist in one kind (bread only), intinction (priest dipping the wafer into the wine), congregations bringing their own bread and wine and the clergy collectively blessing them from the altar ...and the list goes on.

During the last 12 months most, Anglican churches in Melbourne have gone back to holy communion practiced and shared in both kinds (bread and common cup- (if this was their usual practice prior to covid) whilst here at St Margaret's Church this has not been so.

During the past few weeks, you will have noticed that we have been experimenting with different ways of administering the small communion cups and the common cup together.

However, as from Pentecost - Sunday 19th May we will go back to having the common cup only (which also means no intinction).

For many this will be a point of joy as sharing in the eucharist in this way is at the core of their spirituality and not being able to partake in this way has been described as "painful"; whilst for others this will not be so.

Pastorally, I understand that some of you will have underlying health issues or reasons why you do not feel able to share in the common cup at this time but would still like bread **and** wine .

For these members of our church community there will be available pre -consecrated wine in the small glasses and tray which you can consume after you have taken your bread.

Some of you may have reservations and concerns in drinking from the common cup. On speaking with clergy colleagues in our deanery and beyond who have gone back to sharing in the common cup — there has been no evidence in covid being caught and spread in this way.

You all have a few weeks to contemplate for yourself whether you will take wine from the common cup but, just to let you know you are free to share the meal in one kind (bread) until you are 'ready'.

Please feel free to contact me if you wish to explore your own concerns and thoughts in this matter.

Ascension Day

Thursday 9th May marks Ascension Day the moment Jesus literally ascended into heaven before his disciples, at the village of Bethany, near Jerusalem.

Below I have included excerpts from the liturgy for an Ascension Day service. This will give you a sense of the importance of this short season as we wait for Pentecost - when Christians recall how God's Holy Spirit was given to the disciples after Jesus' ascension, empowering them to begin the work of making disciples of all nations. In this season of absence, hope and expectation let us pray the responsory in our own homes

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, for forty days we have been celebrating with joyful hearts the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, his bursting from the tomb and his defeat of the power of sin and death. He appeared to his disciples many times and told them about the kingdom of God.

Today we recall how he left this earth and returned to his Father, ascending into heaven to take his throne over all dominions and powers. Trusting in his reign over all creation, and submitting to his kingly yet loving rule, let us hear the story of his parting.

Ascension Day (cont.)

The Ascension Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1.4-11)

While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. 'This', he said, 'is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.'

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'

When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Ascension Day (cont.)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1.12,13a,14)

Then the disciples returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying. They were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.


